Hoosier Fix 2023 Report

Hoosier Fix is a 501(c)3 Non-Profit that provides free or reduced cost spay/neuter surgeries and vaccinations for dog and cat owners in Marion County, Indiana, and surrounding areas.











When was Hoosier Fix (HF) created?

HF was created in September 2020 and became a 501(c)(3) in February 2021.

Why is spay/neuter so important?

Spaying and neutering a cat or dog reduces the number of unwanted pets in shelters; decreases taxpayer costs (if publicly funded); improves pet health; reduces negative pet behaviors; and saves on the cost of pet care for owners and rescues/shelters. Our goal is to keep all pets with their families for their entire lives.

How is HF different from other organizations?


HF provides personalized service to all clients. We guide the client through every step of the way, from the application process to follow up after surgery. For many clients there is apprehension on having a pet fixed. We alleviate this, through our personalized care for every client.


We also seek to eliminate any obstacles that a client may face. For example, we offer carriers or transportation (free of charge). HF is a 100% volunteer run organization. Our only expenses are the cost for spay/neuter and vaccinations at IndyHumane's Downtown Clinic (456 N. Holmes Avenue, Indy 46222).


Important Information

- Since our founding in September 2020, we have coordinated the spay/neuter of over 1,791 cats and dogs.
- In 2023, we coordinated the spay/neuter of 306 pets 61 dogs and 245 cats.
- The average age of our client base is 38 years old with our oldest at 73 and youngest at 15 (with parent permission).
- Sixty-six (66%) percent of our referrals come from previous clients who have told friends or family about our organization.
- Forty-nine (49%) percent of 2023 clients are primarily renting their living spaces.
- Free transportation to/from IndyHumane was provided for 28 pets in 2023.
- We had 236 pets microchipped in 2023 (some pets were already chipped).
- Of the 306 pets fixed in 2023, we had vaccinations given to 286 of them. These pets received ageappropriate boosters and rabies vaccines.
- We partner with pet related organizations in 4 counties Hendricks, Johnson, Marion & Morgan.










Some of the Reasons for Owners Wanting Their Pet(s) Fixed

"Don't want them (brother and sister) having kittens."	"To help control the pet population."








Top Zip Codes Impacted for 2023 (Reached 32 Zip Codes in Indiana Overall)
